## Faculty Leadership Program

#### **Program Objectives:**

"to produce academic leaders who: (a) have high levels of confidence, determination, and integrity; (b) have unique abilities for innovation, inspiration, and vision; (c) have a conceptual sense of organization for success and capacity for action powered by passion; (d) have capacity to step out, reach out, speak out, bring out the best in other people and make things happen" (Cherif 16) i.

#### **Program Description:**

Academic Affairs, Title III Center for Teaching and Learning, and the Center for Extended and Distance Education co-sponsor the Faculty Leadership Program, which recognizes the importance of the faculty's leadership efforts at Austin Peay.

In exchange for a course release, the Faculty Leadership Program offers an opportunity for selected faculty to learn about available resources, campus groups and organizations, different administrative responsibilities, and other details that would help faculty serve as knowledgeable representatives and leaders of Austin Peay. Accepted applicants meet once a week for an all-day, campus-led event that facilitates this learning process.

Each Tuesday from 8:30 a.m. to 4 p.m., FLP participants visit different campus venues, learn about campus programs and resources, and discuss leadership issues. Most of the semester involves weekly reading assignments in preparation for each day's activities. With the exception of possibly the last day, participants begin and end each day's activities at the Center for Teaching and Learning.
