Austin Library Catalog

- Physical items in the library
- Ebooks purchased directly
- Some Ebooks from databases
- Periodicals

PeaySearch

- Physical items in the library
- Ebooks from all sources
 - Including book chapters
- Periodicals
- Articles from databases
- Newspapers
- APSU resources from ASPIRE
- Open access resources

One Search

- PeaySearch brings the unified search concept to the library.
- Students want a Google-like search option; this brings that to them.
- Broader search means less confusion and less time required.
- Some courses or graduate-level researchers might still delve into databases, but for many, this will not be required.
- Even for those doing more advanced research, PeaySearch is a fantastic starting point to identify search terms and key databases.



PeaySearch for your Research

- You can save (pin) resources and refer back to them later.
- · You can export to citation managers or directly to your references.
 - Always check computer-generated citations!
- You can save searches and request email notifications when something new appears in that search.
- · You can build RSS feeds of searches to monitor for updates.
