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WHAT ARE AUTHENTIC ASSESSMENTS?

- Allow student-centered demonstrations and applications of gained knowledge and skills beyond the classroom.
- Student-centered learning opportunities in which they can apply knowledge and concepts, analyze research findings, justify choices, and develop new and creative connections to address real-world tasks and problems
- Measures students' ability to think critically, complexly, and creatively to develop new ideas and to solve problems.
- Authentic Assessments are Relevant, Relatable, and Real-World Based

THE IMPACT OF AUTHENTIC ASSESSMENTS

- Allows for more transparent, equitable learning experiences
- Can support diverse learners by designing to accommodate different learning styles, preferences, and abilities
- Leads students to a deeper understanding and retention of and engagement with the material
- Develop the ability to brainstorm and think creatively and critically.
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- Deeper constructive and productive learning
- Take ownership of learning
- Increased student retention
- Improved self-efficacy and confidence
- Leads to more autonomous motivation
- Prepares students for the complexities of challenges in the workplace
- Improved career readiness
- Encourages lifelong learning

THE 3 R'S OF AUTHENTIC ASSESSMENTS



RELEVANT

- Allow students to use and apply their knowledge and skills in a relevant setting
- Assessments are relevant to career-related tasks.
- Putting learned knowledge into practice.

RELATABLE

- Requires the use of relatable multiple types of skills
- Practical and meaningful
- · Related to their future work and tasks.
