

# Four-Year Career Readiness Plan

Austin Peay State University is a member of the National Association of Colleges and Employers (NACE). NACE works with educational institutions and companies to track employment trends and share guidance and resources for career development. Below are 8 of the most often sought-after skillsets, or **competencies**, that hiring managers and supervisors are seeking.



Career and Self Development: Proactively develop oneself and one's career through continual personal and professional learning, awareness of one's strengths and weaknesses, navigation of career opportunities, and networking to build relationships within and without one's organization.



**Communication**: Clearly and effectively exchange information, ideas, facts, and perspectives with persons inside and outside of an organization.



**Critical Thinking:** Identify and respond to needs based upon an understanding of situational context and logical analysis of relevant information.



**Equity & Inclusion:** Demonstrate the awareness, attitude, knowledge, and skills required to equitably engage and include people from different local and global cultures. Engage practices that actively challenge the systems, structures, and policies of racism.



**Leadership:** Recognize and capitalize on personal and team strengths to achieve organizational goals.



**Professionalism:** Knowing work environments differ greatly, understand and demonstrate effective work habits, and act in the interest of the larger community and workplace.



**Teamwork:** Build and maintain collaborative relationships to work effectively toward common goals, while appreciating diverse viewpoints and shared responsibilities.



**Technology:** Understand and leverage technologies ethically to enhance efficiencies, complete tasks, and accomplish goals.

#### Freshman Year

### Junior Year

Attend a graduate school info session/fair. Begin preparation for entrance exams (if applicable).







Update your resume and profile in Jobs4Govs.









Research and join professional organizations in your industry.







Take on more responsibilities in campus organizations and jobs. Consider participating in study abroad or service learning.







Apply for an in-depth semester or summer internship opportunity.







Think about serving as a peer mentor or tutor for first-year students.







#### Senior Year

Meet with advisor to complete degree audit and apply for graduation.









Submit graduate school application essays to Career Services for feedback.









Take graduate school entrance exams and complete applications.





Complete capstones/practicums/internships and update your resume on Jobs4Govs.











Schedule a job search prep meeting with a Career Services advisor.













Participate in mock interview days and hiring events for extra practice.









Reach out to employers via LinkedIn for possible openings.











Consider ways to give back to APSU by volunteering, mentoring, etc.
