

Course Continuity Policy

Policy Statement

It is the policy of Austin Peay State University to provide direction, based on best practice, regarding required use of the University's Learning Management System (LMS) for every course, regardless of course modality. The required content described in this policy ensures course continuity and applies to all full-time instructors, full-time tenured or tenure-track faculty, and part-time/adjunct instructors.

Purpose

In the event that an instructor cannot complete course instruction, an alternate instructor must be able to assume responsibility for the course with minimal disruption to students. An alternate instructor may be required in circumstances such as severe illness, incapacitation, death, or termination. Additionally, course continuity requirements will assist chairs and deans who need to resolve an "Incomplete" grade or grade appeal if the instructor is not available or is no longer employed at the university. In these circumstances, minimum requirements for use of the University's LMS are essential for course continuity.

Procedures

Course Continuity

To ensure course continuity in the event that an assigned instructor cannot continue to teach their course, a syllabus and [populated](#) gradebook are required to be posted in the University's LMS. The ADA compliant syllabus must be posted prior to the opening of the course in the University's LMS, in accordance with the schedule determined by the Provost for the opening of the University's LMS courses each term. The syllabus must

include all items listed in the Course Syllabus section of the Faculty Handbook including the Basis and Methods for grading. All Ggrades for evaluated work are required to be posted in the University's LMS so that an accurate recording of grades is available.
