The HON 1000 and PELP 1000 courses will replace the APSU 1000 for Honors and PELP students. These courses will have more substance than the traditional APSU 1000. PELP rubric (prefix) will assist with alleviating confusion for students because of the use of the LDSP rubric (prefix).

Margaret Rennerfeldt asked a question regarding the alignment of the two 1000 courses and Dr. Winters explained the students in these courses write a global issues paper but the remainder of the content is the same. PELP has a little more depth to it as they have a specific assignment in defining leadership and outside speakers are brought in to discuss successful and failed leadership.
