General In-Text Format

• Parenthetical: (Author Last Name, Year)

• Narrative: Author Last Name (Year)

Examples

• Parenthetical citation: (Kabir, 2016)

• Narrative citation: Kabir (2016)

General Reference Format

Author's Last name, First initial. Middle initial. (Year published). *Title of dissertation or thesis* (Publication No. #) [Type of Thesis/Dissertation, Name of Institution]. Database Name. URL (if available)

Examples

Kabir, J. M. (2016). Factors influencing customer satisfaction at a fast food hamburger chain: The relationship between customer satisfaction and customer loyalty (Publication No. 10169573)[Doctoral dissertation, Wilmington University]. ProQuest Dissertations & Theses Global.

- Chang, R. S. (2025). *The role of environmental sustainability practices in corporate decision-making*[Master's thesis, Stanford University]. Stanford Digital Repository.

 - **Publication Numbers:** If provided by the database, include the publication number in parentheses after the title (without italics).
 - **Degree Information:** Include "Doctoral dissertation" or "Master's thesis" in square brackets, followed by the institution name.
 - URLs: Include a URL if accessible for readers. If the URL requires login access, end with the name of the database or repository.
