APA Style Title Hierarchy

APA Style Title Hierarchy

• APA Style includes up to five levels of titles. The number of headings you include will depend on how long and complex your academic writing is. Only use the different headings to create sections and subsections in your writing. In the title case, most words are capitalized.

Avoid

- creating a header that is titled "introduction".
- label headings with numbers or letters
- double-space headings
- add blank lines above or below headings

Level 1

Centered, Bold, Title Case Heading

The text begins as a new paragraph.

Level 2

Flush Left, Bold, Title Case Heading

The text begins as a new paragraph.

Level 3

Flush Left, Bold Italic, Title Case Heading

The text begins as a new paragraph.

Level 4

Indented, Bold, Title Case Heading, Ending With a Period. The text begins on the same line and continues as a regular paragraph.

Level 5

Indented, Bold Italic, Title Case Heading, Ending With a Period. The text begins on the same line and continues as a regular paragraph.
